



These families—for the most part Anglo-Saxon, with a good number of Huguenots and one or two Germans and Irish thrown in for good measure—stretch more or less forward from the 15th century to the beginning of the 21st. Most arrived in America in the 17th century, a second lot during the 18th, and two stragglers in the middle of the 19th. The vast majority came to Virginia or Massachusetts, several others to South Carolina. Almost all of them seem characterized by an exuberant willingness to reinvent themselves, one way or another, as the occasion demands. And here we are.
